If you agree to the scammer's offer, it could cost you tens of thousands of dollars.

How do you know if a solar company is scamming?

Fraud often starts with a sales representative promising major savings on energy costs, a federal tax credit, or even a limited time government-backed solar program. However, once the upfront costs and monthly payments appear on your utility bill, you may realize the offer was a bad deal from the start.

What is solar panel fraud?

Solar panel fraud occurs when unscrupulous companies or individuals deceive homeowners through misleading sales practices, hidden fees, and false promises about solar energy systems. These deceptive practices have multiplied as the residential solar energy industry has expanded significantly over the past decade.

Are free solar panels a scam?

Know that "free" or "no cost" solar panel offers are scams. The federal government does not install solar systems in homes for free.
